Firstly, what is infrastructure on tourism?

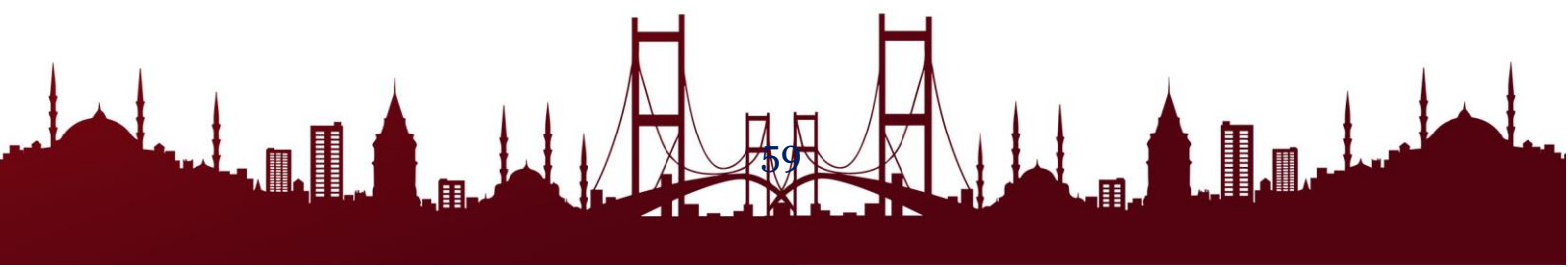

3. United Arab Emirates (UAE)

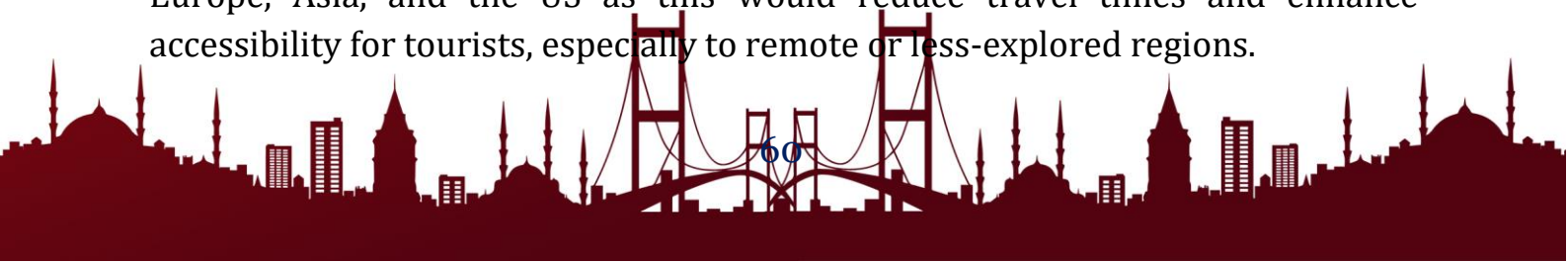
