Recognizing that the high-level talks with the organization also serve to enhance the image of our country, we should note the meeting of President of Uzbekistan Shavkat Mirzivoyev and Director-General of UNESCO on October 8, 2018 at UNESCO Headquarters in Paris, France. The fact that the official visit of President Shavkat Mirziyoyev to France began with UNESCO once again demonstrated the importance of the organization for our country, as well as the fact that Uzbekistan is one of the most important partners for the organization.

According to the Director General of the organization, "Uzbekistan's cooperation with this organization is developing steadily, and both sides are very interested in it". The establishment of a culture of peace and tolerance under the auspices of the Director-General of UNESCO under the auspices of UNESCO, the establishment of the Mirzo Ulugbek International Institute in Samarkand to prevent extremism, information and communication technologies in education at the Tashkent University of Information Technologies.
